A Northern Virginia native, Jamie Milloy obtained her Bachelor's degree in 2011, and has worked in the field of nonprofit Reentry ever since. Jamie has a personal background of misdemeanor infractions that fueled her desire to help others struggling with addiction, stress management, and prosocial decision-making, and informed her choice to enter the Reentry field after graduation. Looking at the factors leading up to arrest, and navigating the barriers that exist post-release, Jamie considers herself to be a comprehensive reentry strategist helping clients to understand the relationship between their past, present, and future.

Currently, Jamie is the Reentry Director for FAILSAFE-ERA, a 501c3 non-profit organization designed to help individuals, families, and communities affected by incarceration; thereby, reducing the rate of recidivism. Additionally, Jamie is a Programs Manager for OAR NOVA, a 501c3 with a similar mission in Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William Counties. Teaching group classes and conducting one-on-one sessions to discuss the relationship between thoughts, feelings, and behaviors is her favorite part of the rehabilitative reentry process.

She is certified in Change Companies Interactive Journaling facilitation, Moral Reconciliation Therapy, MRT Trauma, and MRT Domestic Violence. She is also certified as a Workforce Development Specialist, in Mental Health First Aid, and is also a certified practitioner of Motivational Interviewing techniques.

Jamie enjoys speaking publicly about her experience both as a returning citizen and as a reentry worker over the past decade, in order to bring public awareness to the various issues that impact not only the clients, but the entire community. Speaking to the public is an optimal way to engage volunteers as well as clients, in order for the community to be represented and involved in this growing industry.
