His God-given mission is to empower men and women through the Word of God centered around Salvation, Restoration, and Worship.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania Earl was born to Iler and Delores Richardson. He is the youngest of six siblings. Raised in the Church of the Lord Jesus Christ Apostolic Faith, Earl accepted Jesus Christ at the age of 15. In 1990, he came to know the fullness of the Holy Spirit and the true life-changing power of the Word of God while in the Marine Corps stationed in Hawaii. He joined The City of Refuge Christian Church under Dr. Wayne E. Anderson of Waipahu, Hawaii. His first ministry was the parking lot ministry. Being faithful in attendance and growing in wisdom in the Word of God, he became a Christian Counselor, working with newly saved men, mostly from the military. While deployed in Operation Desert Shield, Desert Storm, Earl worked closely with the Chaplain of 7th Engineer Battalion, praying and counselor Marines and fellowshipping with other believers during War. In 1993 through 1995, He continued to work with numerous ministries while training in California and then in Auburn Alabama.

In 1996 Earl was called to be a minister under the training of Bishop Cartwright of the Word of God Christian Fellowship in West Point, Ga. Over the years, Earl continued to support many ministries by teaching the Word of God and supporting the men's ministries. In 2001, Earl continued the path of ministries with Lighthouse Christian Ministries under Pastor Nobles where he supported prison ministry for the first time. Earl believed his calling from God was to develop and teach men of God. He became the men's ministry leader and continued to grow in the Lord.

In 2013 under the leadership of Bishop Eric Ellis of Philippian Community Church of North Carolina, Earl was ordained Elder and continued to lead the men ministry and teach the Word of God. For three years Earl and his wife Zandra lived in Virginia and drove to Raleigh, North Carolina to hear the Word of God and spiritually grow under Bishop Eric Ellis teaching, preaching and leadership. In 2015, Earl was led to leave and found a ministry in Virginia where he assisted Pastor Clifton Cooley at the Well Church of God in Christian preaching and teaching the Word of God. At the Well COGIC, Earl led the men's ministry, taught Sunday School, and led the Call To Worship. In 2017, Earl joined Zion Church of Fredericksburg under Pastor Troy Dixon and became the men's ministry leader and prison ministry. Earl began to hear the voice of the Lord in developing mighty men for the purpose of the Kingdom of God. Earl's vision of establishing a cross denominational fellowship of men's ministries across different churches was manifested in the United Men's Fellowship (UMF). The UMF became an organization of men of God to support the community by revealing the heart of Christ. In November 2017 named the "Mighty 300", starting with nothing, the UMF fed over 300 hundred families in an area from Manassas to Richmond a collaboration of 8 different ministries. This event was so impressive, it was published in the local Fredericksburg paper.

God spoke to Earl that 2018 would be an explosive year and outpouring. God began to speak through many nights about the hunger of people for the Word of God. Not really understanding what God is asking, Earl told God, Whatever you want Lord I will do. And Just as Abram was called out, God called out Earl to do the work of the Kingdom. Initially, earl focused

on prison ministry and sought guidance and direction from his spiritual father, Bishop Eric Ellis. Through the direction of the Holy Spirit, they begin to architect the birth of New Restoration Outreach Christian Center Fredericksburg.
